
The Siege (Prologue)

The battle of the Alamo



300 against 1 million Persians at the gates of hell.


Battle of Thermopylae






Night creatures:

The Dark Bloods were huge creatures with sharp teeth and claws. They lived in up in the caves not far from the colonist's encampment.




